The NHS Band firmly believes that each student should be actively involved in the program for the entire year and participate in all activities. Students not active in both the marching and concert band do not have the proficiency or skills to perform at the expected level. These students find it very difficult to keep up with the other students' performance abilities who have been playing all year in both ensembles. As with anything of quality, there is a financial cost to participate in the marching band. For over fifteen years, the marching season fee has been \$500. This charge is necessary, as it helps offset the marching show we perform, the additional staffing requirements, the equipment needed to complete the show, and meals and snacks for students during band camp and the fall marching season. You and your student will have the opportunity and responsibility to support the financial requirements with a vast array of programs and fundraisers designed to help defray the cost with little, if any, out of the pocket expense.

Likewise, as has been the case for the past thirty years, a family's financial situation should not be a reason to drop the band. We have several scholarships and assistance programs in place to help students. If you genuinely want to be a part of the Northwestern Purple Regiment, there is a place for you and your child! † A Sports Physical is required for all students in the marching band. Northwestern High School partners with local medical professionals to assist students in obtaining physicals at a discounted rate. *Doctor's Care* on Cherry Rd. is providing this service for \$20.00 through July 31. This physical is the exact requirement to participate in any athletic team at Northwestern High School. The information indicated in this physical form is critical to those charged with the care of your student during the physically strenuous activities placed on our members during practice and performance. On request, the band office will submit a copy of your completed physical to the NHS Athletic Office for your convenience.

We have moved the remainder of our marching band registration forms to an online format. Please complete the **Online Band Registration Form by June 11, 2021**, by using the instructions found within this mailing (yellow sheet).

Please note that we do have some activities scheduled during June. Typically, these would be in July, but we felt that it would be better to have them in June since the students are still in school with the short summer. These include:

- We will hold **Optional Tuesday Evening Rehearsals** on June 1, 8, & 15 from 6:00 to 8:00 in the band room. These are for all instrumentalists woodwind, brass, & percussion.
- We will hold a **Rising 9th Grade Parent Meeting** on Tuesday, June 1, from 6:30 to 7:30 in the NHS Media Center. This meeting is an excellent opportunity to meet the parents who will be caring for your child while they are with the band, how the band operates, the many fundraising opportunities, and ways to help and get involved with the band program at Northwestern.
- We will hold **Chaperone Training Sessions** on Tuesday, June 8 & 15 from 6:30 to 7:30 in the NHS Media Center. This meeting is required for any parent that wishes to chaperone any trip during the 2021-22 school year. We will hold additional sessions later in August, but these will be the only sessions available before band camp starts on July 26.
